Finding Textbooks for CTC Courses

Welcome! This document and its links will assist you in finding textbooks used at Chattahoochee Technical College.

Textbook Buying Advice

- 1) **Confirm that you actually need the book.** You can talk with professors, upperclassmen, TAs, etc., and figure out whether you'll actually be using the book.
- 2) Try to find a free version of that book. Whether it's from your campus library, a local college, or any other source, you'll obviously save money by being creative. OpenStax College and some other open-source initiatives also provide a growing number of free alternatives (links below).
- 3) Determine whether an older version and/or an international version will suffice. If it's approved by a TA or professor, you can usually get a great deal by going with one of these alternatives.
- 4) If you decide that you *must purchase the book*, try to buy the book from a fellow student. Buyback services offer notoriously shameful prices, so they'll be super eager to sell their book at a fair price (and give you a deal). Facebook Groups are probably the most commonly-used manner of accomplishing this at this point.
- 5) Finally, if you must buy the assigned book, compare prices using the links below.

Borrow - CTC Title Catalog Search

As a free alternative, students **might** find textbooks in the CTC library collection.

The CTC library does not purchase textbooks, but it will accept donations from faculty or students of textbooks in good condition, and will add them to the collection. In some cases the library will place textbooks or other course materials **on reserve**. Generally this means they are available for use in the library only. Note that the **library's copy of the textbook may be an older edition than the one that is used in the course.**

Students can search in the [library catalog](#) by textbook title, author or ISBN to determine if the book is in the library collection.

eTextbooks - What is an eTextbook?

eTextbooks are eBooks, or digital versions of printed textbooks. They are delivered over the internet or via a computer network. Textbooks can be accessed either by download or read directly from the vendor's web server. They can be read using a computer monitor or other digital device (such as an electronic book reader, like a Kindle or Nook).

eTextbook Tips

Some eTextbooks work with PCs, some with Macs, some with specific eBook readers. **Be sure to confirm the version of the eTextbook you want to buy works with the device you plan to use.**

Use the ISBN of the textbook used in your class to verify you're purchasing an eTextbook that matches that textbook.

Note that eTextbooks are available for purchase or rental (also called "subscription"). For subscription options also check the websites listed on the [Rent Textbooks](#) section below. eTextbook rental provides access to the eTextbook for a limited time (like borrowing from a library).

eTextbook printing is limited. If printing is important to you, be sure to check this capability before you buy.
